

6th Grade Religion Exam Review

For the final exam, students should:

Be able to write each of the 10 commandments.

Be able to write out the 7 gifts and 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit

Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, Fear of the Lord (Awe)

Fruits of the Holy Spirit: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-Control, Chastity

Be able to write out the liturgical year including Holy Days of Obligation

Liturgical Year: Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent (Triduum), Easter (Pentecost), Ordinary Time

Holy Days: January 1—Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God
40 after Easter—Solemnity of the Ascension
August 15—Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary
November 1—Solemnity of All Saints
December 8—Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception
December 25—Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Be able to write out the 7 sacraments.

Sacraments: Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist, Confirmation, Matrimony, Holy Orders, Anointing of the Sick

Be able to write out the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy

Spiritual Works of Mercy: Admonish the Sinner, Instruct the Ignorant, Counsel the Doubtful, Comfort the Sorrowful, Bear Wrongs Patiently, Forgive all injuries, Pray for the Living and the Dead

Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the Hungry, Give Drink to the Thirsty, Clothe the Naked, Visit the Sick, Visit the Imprisoned, Shelter the Homeless, Bury the Dead

Know, in order, the parts of the Mass.

Greeting, Confetior, Lord Have Mercy, Glory to God, First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel, Homily, Creed, Petitions, Offering of Gifts, Washing of Hands, Sanctus, Invocation of the Holy Spirit, Consecration (Transubstantiation), Our Father, Rite of Peace, Lamb of God, Communion Rite, Final Blessing.
